Study programmes to meet all needs

Hereward College offers courses for residential and day students at our Coventry campus.

Our pathway approach to learning ensures that all levels are catered for and we work with you to build a programme of study to help you achieve your goals.

In our Foundation Pathway, courses run from Pre-Entry up to Entry Level 2; with a Learning for Life sensory curriculum specifically aimed at students with profound and multiple learning difficulties.

The Explorer Pathway caters for students working at Entry Level 3 and Level 1 and our Discovery Pathway is for students progressing to Level 2 and Level 3 courses.

English and maths are included in all programmes and there is a clear focus on employability and enterprise.

For learners with ASC with more complex sensory or social and emotional mental health needs we have introduced Foundation Plus and Aspire; individualised and targeted intervention programmes which are supported by highly skilled experts.

We also offer work skills and employability programmes, including supported internships, working in partnership with regional and national employers.

Highly ambitious internship programme

Learners on supported internships participate in a highly ambitious programme. Subsequently, interns become valued employees and progress to permanent roles with the employer at the end of their internship.

What will I study?

Entry Level 3 or Level 1. Students will choose a vocational Pathway into employment:

- Creative Arts & Digital Skills
- Business, IT and Enterprise
- Performing Arts & Music Production
- Outdoor Learning -Horticulture & Construction
- Manufacturing mini Prism engineering workshop (Level 1 only)
- Sport & Leisure
- Catering, Hospitality & Tourism

Learning focuses on the personal qualities and work skills required in each sector and leads to a Diploma in Skills for Further Learning and Employment.


What can I do after completing the programme?
